The design firm Workshop/apd completely overhauled the Printing House, a 1911 Italian Renaissance-style building in the West Village, to carve out 64 new residences. For a 1,700-square-foot, two-bedroom bachelor pad, workshop/apd's interior design team sought to take advantage of the building's innate natural light, city views, and spacious layout. For the client, a native of Hawaii, the firm added natural touches such as driftwood, tempered by industrial elements, including a patinaed metal staircase and Vipp shelving. The result is a cozy, bright home that feels both well curated and well lived in.
